Are you age 60 or older, live in the Detroit Metropolitan area and need help, but don't know where to go?

We are here to help you discover your options and access services when you have concerns about housing, health care and insurance, nutrition, house cleaning, yard work, transportation, opportunities for socialization and recreation, financial assistance, legal issues, or anything else of concern.

Abuse Prevention/Elder Rights

Abuse of elders takes many different forms, some involving intimidation or threats, some involving neglect, and others involving financial exploitation. The most common are:

- Physical Abuse
- Sexual Abuse
- Emotional Abuse
- Neglect or Abandonment
- Financial Exploitation
- Healthcare Fraud and Abuse



Senior Advocacy

The goal of this Service is to provide the support and assistance needed to promote and secure happier independent and congregate living.

Michigan elders have a right to:

- Live in dignity and security.
- Be protected and free from abuse, neglect, and exploitation.
- Receive services they qualify for and are entitled to.
- Be informed about their civil and legal rights.
- Have access to adequate food, clothing, shelter, privacy and health care.
- Make decisions about their own care and quality of life.

Reporting Abuse

Reports may be made to the sheriff, chief of police or to any County Department of Human Resources. An Adult Protective Services office is located in each county within the State of Michigan
